

Diagnostic Medical Sonography (Ultrasound) Diploma

Diagnostic Medical Sonography, also known as Ultrasound, is a specialized profession that uses technology involving the application of high-frequency sound waves on patients to aid in medical diagnoses. This program prepares students, through theoretical and clinical training, to conduct Ultrasound examinations, focusing on areas such as obstetrics and gynecology, abdomen and superficial structures, and vascular sonographic studies. Students are trained to work as part of a patient-care team to assess patients and provide information to physicians for diagnosis and ongoing monitoring.



Early Childhood Education (ECE)

Suncrest College offers a range of Early Childhood Education (ECE) programs designed to prepare students for rewarding careers in early learning and child care settings. Whether you are just beginning your studies or advancing your career, Suncrest provides flexible options to meet your goals.

CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT (LEVEL 1) COURSES

The ECE CoA provides the foundational skills and knowledge to work in licensed early learning centres, preschools, and other child care programs. This program provides the minimum training required to work as a child care worker in Saskatchewan. Students complete three introductory courses on a part-time, course-by-course basis.

DIPLOMA (LEVEL 2 & 3) COURSES

These courses allow learners to work towards completion of their ECE diploma or their level 2 or 3 government certifications. These courses focus on leadership, inclusive practice, and advanced program planning, preparing graduates for supervisory roles in early learning and child care. Courses are offered part-time, on a course-by-course basis.

Skilled Trades

Heavy Equipment and Truck and Transport Certificate

1 YEAR

The Heavy Equipment and Truck and Transport Technician Certificate equips students with the skills to diagnose, service, and repair heavy-duty trucks, buses, and off-road equipment used in construction, transportation, and agriculture. Through classroom instruction and extensive hands-on training, students learn to work with the mechanical, hydraulic, fuel, and electrical systems that keep industry moving.

Graduates receive credit for Level 1 and Level 2 technical training periods, along with approximately 1,000 trade time hours toward their apprenticeship. Students may choose to apply their certificate toward either the Heavy Duty Equipment Technician trade or the Truck and Transport Mechanic trade with the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC), giving them a strong head start toward journeyperson status.

Welding Certificate

The Welding Certificate program provides comprehensive training in welding theory, safety, and practical skills. Students gain hands-on experience with a variety of welding processes, including oxyacetylene, shielded metal arc, gas metal arc, and flux-cored arc welding, as well as blueprint reading, fabrication, and layout.

Through extensive shop practice, students build the technical skills and confidence needed to succeed in the welding trade. Graduates are well prepared for employment in a variety of industries and receive Level 1 and 2 credit toward apprenticeship training as a Welder with the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC).

Power Engineering Technician Certificate - Fourth Class

The Power Engineering Technician Certificate provides the technical knowledge and practical training required to operate and maintain boilers, turbines, compressors, and other industrial equipment that produce and distribute energy. Students gain hands-on experience in mechanical, electrical, and control systems while preparing for industry certification.

This program prepares students to write the Fourth Class Power Engineer exams with the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan (TSASK). Upon successful completion, graduates also receive credit for one year of steam time, making them eligible to obtain a license to operate as a Fourth Class Power Engineer in small to medium capacity plants. With additional experience and education, students may continue on to Third Class certification, opening doors to more advanced roles in the industry.

In collaboration with the **University of Saskatchewan**, Suncrest College offers all four years of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program.


The first year is a pre-professional year of Arts and Science courses, followed by three years of nursing education and clinical practice.

Student Aid

Student aid helps cover tuition, textbooks, and living expenses for Saskatchewan students. The Government of Saskatchewan and the Government of Canada provide loans and grants for both full-time and part-time learners. **The amount you receive depends on your personal situation**, including your program, financial need, and living costs.

- Interest-free while you study
- No payments until six months after graduation
- Lower interest rates than most other borrowing options

Student Line of Credit

A student line of credit is a flexible borrowing option from a bank that can be used for tuition, living costs, and other education expenses. It's a good option for **students who don't qualify for a student loan** or who need extra funds on top of their student aid.

- Only pay interest on the amount you borrow
- Make interest-only payments while you're in school
- Borrow and repay as needed without reapplying
- Higher credit limits for professional or specialized programs



BURSARIES:

Financial awards based on demonstrated financial need, often from schools or organizations, and also do not need to be repaid.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

Financial awards based on academic achievement, leadership, or other criteria. These also do not need to be repaid.
